DÉPFLIES is a 1/2 hour, bilingual, Canadian comedy series

LOGLINE

After inheriting the family dépanneur, Peter and his step-sister Marie-Isa struggle to make ends meet. Dreams are pitted against responsibility as Peter and his dépfly friends get caught up in various impulsive adventures around Montreal.

SYNOPSIS

The hardworking and responsible Marie-Isa clashes with Peter when he fails to do his job as bike delivery guy at their family owned dépanneur. The well-intentioned Peter is distracted by his dépfly friends, cultivating his dream of a rap-rock career and falling in love (seemingly with every woman he meets). Meanwhile Dépflies Roger and Nancy navigate through a bilingual relationship and Zoe, a rugged punk, is always willing to spill her heart out as the daily action in and around the dépanneur introduces the audience to a variety of interesting characters.

BILINGUALISM

The bilingualism in DÉPFLIES is reflective of contemporary Montréal. The comedy is rooted in characters, not caricature because in the end it's not about language, it's about stories that resonate.

MUSIC

DÉPFLIES is set to an all-Canadian soundtrack and features original music from Montréal composers and producers. The songs are built into the narrative of the show, often presented in the form of a short music video.

DÉPANNEUR (DÉP):

A corner store that sells a variety of goods. They are plentiful in Québec and, unlike convenience stores in other parts of Canada, a dépanneur sells beer. DÉPFLIES celebrates this unique aspect of Québec culture.
